Note:

- 46 - Includes persons who have attended courses at post secondary institutions and who may or may not have a high school graduation certificate. Excludes persons with a post secondary certificate, diploma or degree.
- 47 - Referred to as "Other non-university certificate or diploma" in previous censuses, this sector includes non-degree-granting institutions such as community colleges, Collège d'enseignement général et professionnel (College of General and Vocational Education), private business colleges and technical institutes.
- 50 - The overall quality of the education variables from the 2001 Census is acceptable. However, users of the 2001 Census data on school attendance are cautioned that the counts for the 15 to 19 year olds not attending school category may be too high. The proportion of persons aged 15 to 19 who indicated they had not attended school in the school year prior to the census increased from 18% in 1996 to 23% in 2001. This variable requires further research.
