Located in downtown Winnipeg the University of Winnipeg is consistently ranked in among the Top 10 in the country on an annual basis by Macleans magazine and The Globe and Mail newspaper. The University of Winnipeg is a leader in academic excellence, Aboriginal education, environmental studies and sustainability, and theatre and the arts. Over 9,000 undergraduate and graduate students attend courses at the University of Winnipeg, which employs a faculty and staff of over 700.

Led by the University of Winnipeg's Community Renewal Corporation (UWCRC), the University has recently undertaken and completed four new major building projects including:

The Richardson College for the Environment brings together the Canada Research Chair in Indigenous Science Education, the Canada Research Chair in Inner City Issues and Community Learning and Engagement as well as the Institute of Urban Studies.
