

# World, China, USA, Canada Real GDP Growth Forecast (Percentage Change)











### Canada GDP (Monthly and Quarterly)



#### Canada's GDP by Expenditure, Seasonally Adjusted (% Chg from 2019-Q4)











# GDP Growth by Province/Terr. and Manitoba GDP by Industry Share: 2020












### Manitoba's Employment by Month (Jan 2022)










# Unemployment Rate by Geography, Sex, Age Group (%)

by Geography, Sex and Age Group; Unadjusted (%)










# Manitoba <u>Goods</u> Employment Index: (January 2022 vs Feb 2020)








# Manitoba <u>Services</u> Employment Index: (January 2022 vs Feb 2020)

### Manitoba's Service Industries Employment Index (100 = same as Feb 2020)













### Manufacturing Sales – December 2021















### Manitoba Durable and Non-durable manufacturing Index (Dec'21/Feb'20)













#### Wholesale Trade – December 2021












#### Manitoba Retail Trade – December 2021



- Manitoba retail sales in Dec'21 were 2.17 billion, up nearly 7 per cent month/month.
- This is up 46 per cent over February 2020.








### Manitoba Retail Trade by Industry Index (Dec'21/Feb'20)

- Strong Index (100 = same as Feb'20):
- Sports, hobby, book, music (Index of 267)
- Electronic Appliances (index of 231)
- Clothing (Index of 195)
- Weaker than average Index: (down on lockdowns and non-essential goods)
- Furniture Furnishings (Index of 128)
- Gasoline (index of 126)
- Motor vehicles (index of 121)

#### Canada's Retail E-commerce Sales Index – Dec'21/Feb'20


- Record high \$4.7 billion in December 2020
- Dec'21 was \$4.1 billion, or 154 per cent higher than in Feb'20.
- E-commerce sales consistently higher than prior year by 64 per cent or more since April 2020







### Manitoba 2020 Merchandise Trade by Month (\$Millions)










### Index of Manitoba's Domestic Exports by Commindex (100 = same as prior year)



### COVID-19 response changing

### Canada is well-positioned to ease restrictions, and head towards an endemic situation


- High vaccine uptake/availability, rapid tests and therapeutics are available.
- Some will need or want to continue to wear masks and take other precautions
- Monitoring by public health agencies will continue but is likely to become routine and less of a public event.
- Expect border controls to continue, but for compliance to become cheaper and easier.
  - This will encourage more flights as business and personal tourism continues to return.







# Manitoba Total Food Services and Drinking Places Index (100 = same as January 2020)










### Winnipeg Airport Authority Passenger Counts by Trip Type














### Canada Budget Deficit as a Share of GDP

The Economic and Fiscal Update 2021 of the Federal Government noted the following:


- COVID-19 personal and business transfers were projected to decline sharply in 2022-23 after two years of extraordinary levels.
- Economic growth is adding to tax revenues
  - Deficit/GDP declining as a result
- Priorities included:
  - Finishing the fight against COVID-19
  - Support for people
  - Support for business







### Changes in Manitoba Government Deficit Forecast (\$millions)



The waterfall chart shows the components of the 2021/23 deficit projection. Beginning with the **budgeted deficit of \$1,597 million** in Budget 2021, the revenue changes were driven by COVID-19 and economic recovery. Expenditures changes were minor. The changes result in a **revised deficit forecast of \$1,123 million**.



### Risks: Real GDP Growth Rate Scenarios (% change)










#### **Brandon 2022 Proposed Budget**

Brandon 2022 Revenues (\$93.6 Million)




#### Brandon 2022 Expenses (\$93.6 Million)








### Population Pyramid and growth over the last 20 years















### Canada Immigration Plans (2022 – 2024)













### All-items CPI Inflation by Geography











### Bank of Canada Interest Scenarios, size of balance sheet















### Risk: Russian Invasion of Ukraine 2022

- It is unclear how and when this will be resolved. So, what do we know?
- Harsh official sanctions and many Western firms pausing or ending activity in Russia.
- Potential to have a stagflationary effect if it drags on
- Russia, Ukraine and/or Belarus are important suppliers of
  - Wheat and other crops (Rus, UKR)
  - Fertilizers (Rus, Belarus)
  - Oil and gas (Rus)
  - Numerous minerals (Rus)







### **Economic Growth: Enabling Factors**

Factor	Example
Simple and transparent rules	Work to simplify rules in the Winnipeg area and elsewhere
Available, serviced employment land	E.g., Brandon has <u>undeveloped</u> industrial lands serviced by CN and CP.
Water reclamation opportunity	e.g., Through the <u>Water Reclamation Facility</u> , the volume of treated effluent available for use as industrial use water is in the range of 20-25 ML per day
Updating Bridges, Aiport Master Plan	e.g., Replacing <u>Daly Overpass</u> (increase capacity), Updating Airport Master plan.





### **Enables Economic Growth: GDP Per Capita**

This makes it easier for firms to pick Manitoba when investing and expanding jobs

Factor	Example
Sufficient Capital	Startup, Growth and other capital to grow businesses
Encourage R&D	Federal and provincial R&D investment incentives
Various Tax credits	Encourage activity
Skills training, talent attraction	Can boost labour productivity and eventually wages. E.g. <u>EDW</u> <u>Talent Hub</u> , Retrain Manitoba. Expands the skilled work force, Rural and Northern Immigration pilot program.
Real Estate Developments	Larger mixed use residential/commercial. Strong residential construction, quick absorption rates, low <u>vacancy rates</u> . E.g. use of TIF for WestVic <u>Common</u> .





### **Manitoba Economy Summary**

#### Weakness:

 High contact industries continue to suffer, along with their suppliers. E.g., Tourism, accommodations, airline passengers, restaurants. Expect to recover fully by 2024.

#### • Strengths:

- Wholesale, Ecommerce, Air cargo, food manufacturing, construction/renovation supply chain,
- Risks/Opportunities:
- Russian invasion of Ukraine, disruption of wheat, oil, nat. gas markets
- Supply chain and lack of primary/intermediary inputs (1st half of 2022 or later)
- Risk of rising debt payments as interest rates rise over the coming years.
- Need to keep growing the economy to enables the continued shrinkage of the deficit

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
